Who We Are: Multi-Purpose Community Action Agency (MPCAA) is one of 23 community action programs in the state of Kentucky. The agency serves the counties of Bullitt, Shelby and Spencer.

MPCAA is part of a national movement created in 1964 with the passing of the Economic Opportunity Act. Community Action Agencies work on behalf of individuals and families to help them improve their daily living situations and to stabilize the family unit.

Community Action is about real people; the individuals who volunteer time and money; the individuals and families who find a road out of poverty into self-sufficiency; and the agencies themselves whose dedicated staff encourage and inspire.

Multi-Purpose Community Action Agency provides a variety of services to clients over 60 years of age, to low-income clients and to at-risk families. MPCAA is incorporated as a private nonprofit 501(c)(3) agency and is governed by a volunteer board of directors.

The agency has been providing services for more than 40 years and continuously strives to identify needs of the community and to develop services to meet those needs. Through our various program services we promote self-sufficiency and independent living, helping our clients to achieve their own success by focusing on the positive aspects of their lives.

Dear Friends,

One of the joys of preparing an annual report is that it gives us the opportunity to look back and be thankful for all that has been accomplished. The past year was filled with wonderful opportunities and many challenges. Here are the highlights:

- Provided 7,783 hot luncheon meals to the elderly
- Provided 14,993 home delivered meals to the elderly
- Provided 27,793 units of support services to the elderly
- Provided supportive services to 1,384 unduplicated senior citizens in our service areas
- Assisted 2,245 families with \$399,065 in heating assistance
- Weatherized homes for 16 low income families to help lower energy costs
- Began weatherizing Jefferson County Homes in March, 2018 with 1 completed
- Provided 2,730 boxes of food to senior citizens
- Provided 819 boxes of food and 1,651 boxes of produce to low-income families (Spencer)
- Provided assistance to 97 families for Louisville Water Utility bills in the amount of \$13,957 (Bullitt County)
- Served 40 families with other Utility Assistance through Wintercare funds
- Served 13 families with heating assistance through the Winterhelp program
- Provided 9 families with \$450 of clothing vouchers from Goodwill
